"Jack in the Pulpit"

5" finished - 5 1/2" unfinished

Use your scraps to make a new version of this fine antique quilt from the International Quilt Study Center & Museum in Lincoln, Nebraska.

Fabric and Cutting (for 1 block)

Assorted dark prints in blue, red, yellow and black

1 A Cut one 4" square.

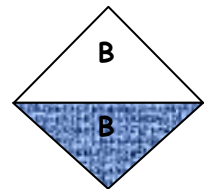
4B Cut two 2 1/8" squares and cut them diagonally once.

Light print or solid

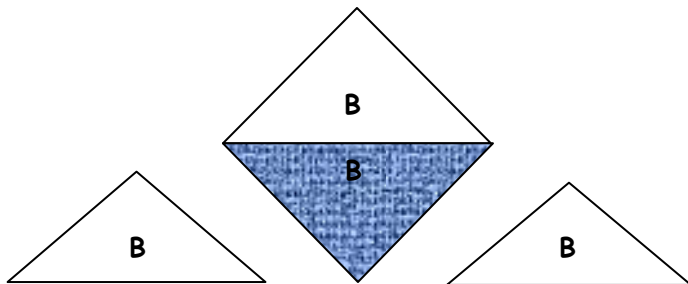
12B Cut six 2 1/8" squares and cut them diagonally once.

Sewing

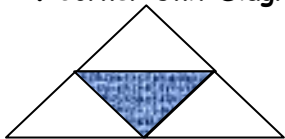
1. Sew a light and dark triangle together to form a 1/2 square triangle. Make 4.
2. Sew 2 light triangles to each side of the unit made above to make 4 Corner Units.
3. Sew Corner Unit to each side of "A" patch as shown in Block Assembly Diagram.



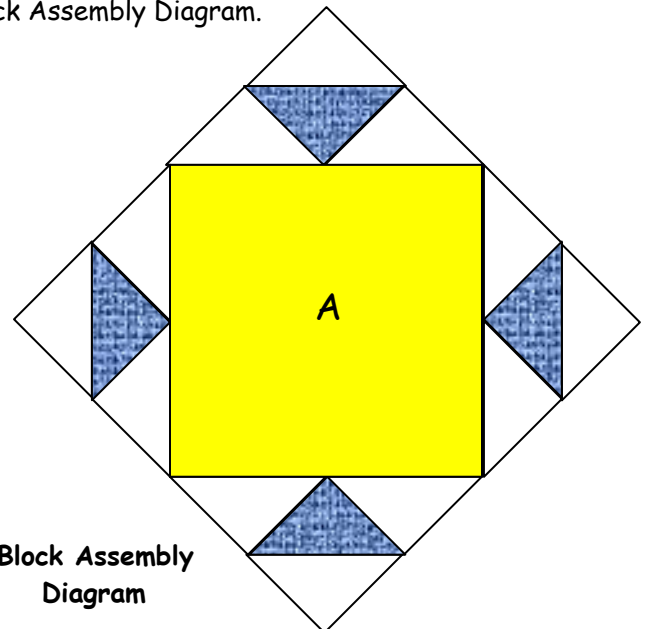
1. Half square triangle
